Playground

We have learned through having Bernie & Tino here just how important it is to have a playground. We have lots of room to run around and play, but nothing to play on. We had Norman clear a part of the remaining jungle from inside the chain-link fence before he left. We are now starting the process of building a

playground for the children in that cleared area.

We are building some of the equipment out of things we already have like this mini-tire swing for the small children. We are also using some old tires that can be cleaned up and painted. A see-saw made from an old pipe and a board. We have planted trees for shade and for looks. There is so much that we would like to

put in the playground, but don't have the means or the time. We would like to have a large playhouse, jungle gym, slide and swings. In short we would like to have a fantastic place for these children. We are doing all we can for now, but

would like to have a team come and help us out. We were hoping that someone that receives this newsletter would take this ministry & the children to heart and say "YES! I would like to help with the playground." Then go back to their

youth group, lady's or men's group, church, or just decide "I can go". We are wanting about eight to ten hard workers to come and move this project ahead.

Don't think there is nothing for you to do. There are so many different things that need to be done to build a decent playground. Here are just a few of the jobs; painting, burying old tires, pouring concrete, putting together the swings and slides, building the playhouse, etc. Something for every age and skill level. We figure an eight day work team will be able to really get a lot accomplished. Our timetable is completely open with one exception. July 6th through August 6th is already booked for a team to come and work on our shower facility. (See the Teen Missions International website if you want to be on that team.)
