Vacation/Deputation



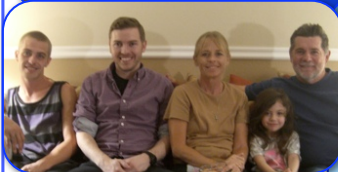

The other reason we have returned to the U.S. at this time is to promote the ministry in Belize and seek financial support. We have been speaking in churches, Bible study groups and to individuals. We are looking for like minded people to join us in the work we are doing.

We have been in Belize since December 2010 doing the work the Lord has called us to. We are working with the local churches to assist them in reaching the people of Orange Walk for Jesus. We help with discipleship, teaching and preaching. We also lead Bible studies and Child Evangelism Fellowship's "Five Day Clubs" in the summer. In short, we minister in whatever way the Lord brings to us. One of the desires of our heart is to help the children in our area.

There is such a big need with the little children. We would also like to start what we call a "Young Mothers" program. Too often young girls are abused in the home, even as young as 10-12. If the girl gets pregnant the Belize government removes them from the home. Currently there is only one facility in Belize that cares for all of these abused girls.

Our facility is perfect for this type of ministry. We have dormitories, a large kitchen and a classroom. What we would like to do is take in these young girls with their babies, giving them a home where they will be safe. Provide a nursery to care for the babies while the mothers complete their education and are taught the skills they need to be a good mother. Our dream is to provide them with security for the present and a hope for the future.

What can you do?

So often people believe the only thing missionaries do is ask for more money. We want to state right up front that is not what we are doing. We are asking you to pray for this program. We need the Lord to bring all of this together. We would never seek to start something that is not in line with God's will for us or our ministry. So, we ask that this dream be bathed in prayer.

The other thing we would ask you to do is to pray the Lord would raise up workers that would like to be a part of this ministry. We believe the Lord is already speaking to people to join with us. And, when they answer His call we will have the needed workforce to make this "Young Mother's" program a reality.
