Prior to Bill going to Ghana we sent out a number of inquires to many different countries and missionaries.

They included; Ghana, Malawi, Cameroon, and Uganda. There were two different ministries in Uganda, but all of these other ministries let us know early on that they were not interested in our rabbit proposal. So once they were out of the equation we focused on Ghana and Globelink Foundation. With all of you praying with us for a clear direction and timetable we were sure to get a answer. We do appreciate all of your prayers, and ask you to continue praying as we move ahead.



This is a picture of the houses on the Globelink mission base. We will be staying in one of the rooms of the building on the left. The base is not finished yet but Sammy is

making great progress. Especially if you consider he has only been working on it for two years. The big tree in the middle of the courtyard is a Shea tree, and it produces a lot of Shea nuts. This is Sammy standing next to Bill. Sammy has been working with Globelink for many years. Besides all of the construction, he also teaches several Kids Clubs in different villages each week. Sammy has a great love of the Lord and only desires to do His will.



These are two of the Kids Clubs that Sammy teaches. These children come from the nearby villages to study God's word. This is a typical classroom setting for Sammy. The children are excited to come and they all desire to learn about Jesus.



One of our ministries that we will be doing in Damongo is helping Sammy with these Kids Clubs.

We do not desire to take them over, but to assist with what he is already doing. We have learned long ago the local workers can do a much better job teaching in their communities. They know the culture, it's boundaries and most of all, how to reach the people they are ministering to. So we will be coming alongside Sammy to help in whatever capacity he needs. One of the needs he has specifically asked us to help with is the children's education. Sammy has never attended school, and can't even read. He wants us to work with the children to help them with their english, spelling, and how to read better. We are more than happy to help in this way, and look forward to not only helping the children but teaching Sammy to read as well.



Rabbits


We have stated in previous newsletters that it has been our desire to take the knowledge we have of raising rabbits and to teach others what we know. When speaking with Danny & Sue (directors of Globelink Foundation) about our desire to teach people about rabbits, they fell in love with the idea and said it was exactly what they were looking for on their base.

The northern region of Ghana, specifically Damongo, is very dry and getting clean water is always difficult. Danny had a well drilled on the base and he provides fresh water, free of charge, to the nearby villagers.



These young girls come to the base twice a day to get water. Danny saw an opportunity to minister to these girls while they wait their turn for water.

Danny hired a local Pastor, Pastor Gideon, who now comes to the base several times each week to teach these girls all about Jesus. The followup ministry that Danny has planned is a girls vocational school located on the base. Sammy has started the construction of the girls dormitory. Sammy, Pastor Gideon and a couple other local people will be the teachers at the school. This is where we come in. Danny wants us to teach the girls how to raise rabbits, chickens, & doves, along with gardening. When we arrive at the base we will get started on the construction of the rabbit house. We will also start working with local farmers to grow the food necessary for the rabbits and chickens. Plus, we will start the construction of the garden. We estimate the total time needed to build the building, grow the animals, and teach all aspects of this project to be a minimum of two years.



In addition to the rabbit project we will be helping out around the base and, as we mentioned before, working with the children attending the Kids Clubs. We are very excited to be getting back into full time ministry and especially looking forward to what the Lord has in mind.

Time Frame

We are currently committed to our camp host position on Mt. Lemmon until the end of October. It is our desire to leave for Ghana as soon after that as we can. In order for that to happen there are several things we need to get done. First and foremost is raise the necessary monthly financial support that we will need to remain in Ghana. Second is to sell our RV, truck and car along with the rest of our things. The Lord has proven Himself time and time again and so we are confident He will raise up the supporters we need. We have already received a new donor that is excited to be a part of what the Lord is doing.
